We Are Honored To Present
Brandeis University
Senior Lecturer Jennifer A. Cleary
discussing
"Theater for Social Change"

Professor Cleary has taught in the theater arts department at Brandeis University for 17 years, mentoring and teaching stage management, oral communication and applied theatre. She earned her EdM in Arts-in – Education from Harvard University and is a proud member of Actors' Equity Association. Professor Cleary received the Louis Demitz Brandeis Prize for Excellence in Teaching in 2015.

"Theatre of the Oppressed" is the key work of Brazilian theater director Augusto Boal who was influenced by Brazilian educator-philosopher Paolo Freire. Boal believed that theater has a purpose and power beyond mainstream theater forms, particularly in helping those facing oppression.

He coined the concept of an audience of "Spect-actors," actively rehearsing ideas for change in people's lives, rather than being passive spectators. Professor Cleary will discuss his methods of using theater techniques to help create social dialogue and talk about his influence and legacy around the world.
